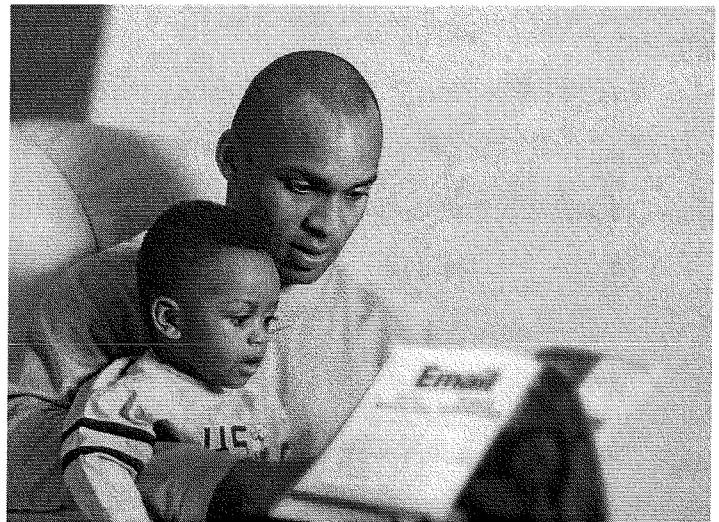


Is your child struggling with reading?

Having difficulty with reading is a common problem. As many as 1 in 5 children are affected by reading problems, ten million children in America alone. (Shaywitz, 2004). Could your child be one of these 10 million?

Dyslexia is a language-based disorder that affects reading and is thought to reflect difficulties with identifying the sounds that make up words and sometimes difficulties in attention.

If this sounds like your child, he or she may be eligible to participate in a clinical research study at the University of California at Irvine. Doctors are studying an FDA-approved medication in an investigational use, for children who have the symptoms of Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) with dyslexia or dyslexia alone. Some children with ADHD alone may also participate in this study. If your child is between the ages of 10 and 16 and displays difficulties in reading, please call the UCI Child Development Center at **949-824-1819** to learn more about this research study.
